All I really need to know about how to live and what to do and how to be I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate school mountain, but there in the sand pile at school.

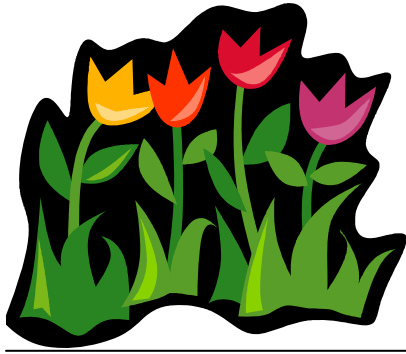
These are the things I learned:

- * Be aware of wonder. Remember the little seed in the Styrofoam cup: the roots go down and the plant goes up and nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.
- * Goldfish and hamsters and white mice and even the little seed in the Styrofoam cup - they all die. So do we.
- * And then remember the Dick-and-Jane books and the first word you learned - the biggest word of all—LOOK.

Just two more words from me: Be kind—to your leaders, to your minister, to your staff, to one another, and, most of all, to yourselves.

UUA Trustee Tidbits

June is the month many of us journey to General Assembly; it will be fun to be with literally thousands of UUs, experience excellent workshops, and be a part of the Open Space Technology “experiment”. I predict much success as we learn the concerns and ideas from all those who participate. For those of you interested in the recent April Board of Trustees (BOT) meeting my lengthy report is in the May District Packet and/or on-line at the District website.

This month the column will be about the Panel on Theological Education, one of the twenty-some UUA Board of Trustees appointed committees and task forces. The Panel on Theological Education, which meets two times each year, makes evaluations and recommendations for the expenditure of funds from the Theological Education Endowment Trust subject to the approval of the BOT. The Panel was established shortly after the Unitarian Universalist Trust for Theological Education was set up as a result of a generous gift from the then North Shore Unitarian Universalist Society. The Panel on Theological Education’s original charter suggested that 60% of its income be devoted to three schools: Meadville Lombard Theological School, Starr King for the Ministry, and Harvard Divinity School. The source of the funds is a percentage of the income drawn from the principal of the fund. Depending upon the availability of funding, the Panel entertains grant requests that further theological education in its broader interpretations. The balance of the funds is made available to continuing education and religious education which might not be accomplished through the theological schools.

At the BOT’s most recent meeting we directed the Panel on Theological Education to present recommendations to the BOT that would make the funding of ministerial formation, development, and excellence the first priority for the use of the Panel’s resources, rather than the current singular focus on support for theological schools. The BOT asked that the Panel present a timeline for the preparation of these recommendations to the BOT for its June, 2007 meeting.

UU in the Pines

We have a wonderful natural camp and conference center near us in Brooksville, Florida, called *UU in the Pines*. *The Pines* was purchased in 1987 and is a 501c(3) organization and an independent affiliate of UUA.

The Pines is located on 14 acres of hardwood and pine forest with facilities including a main lodge with a 'great hall', kitchen, dining room, library, and several meeting rooms. Additional meeting rooms are in the Cedar House. With three guest houses, *The Pines* can sleep a total of 60 people. Of course, more can occupy the land in camping areas for tents.

We recently stayed overnight at *The Pines*. (First, there was resistance from Ollis who had heard that it was not very nice – ask him what he thinks now.) It is only six miles off of I-75 near

Brooksville, which is about an hour from our home in Brandon. While we didn't get to try it out, the BBQ place as you turn onto Cedar Lane looked welcoming, and we noted that there are hotels nearby for those who just can't tolerate the 'camping experience'.

We were greeted by many friendly faces and the full time director, Suzanne Gagan. Suzanne provided us with linens and towels. Ok – no they were not matching sets and we had to make our own beds, but they were fresh and clean! We found a room with two twin beds and got busy. All of the rooms have at least two twins, but some are dorm style so get ready to be friendly. By now you have guessed that you won't have a private bathroom either. It's not a Hyatt!

Once our beds were made, we met everyone for dinner at a local restaurant. During the conversation we found out that there are some great activities nearby including canoeing, bicycling, hiking. Just minutes away from *The Pines*!! We had no time for that on this trip, but it certainly will be planned for the next time.

After dinner, there was enough daylight for a hike around the property. The Gazebo is large enough for 15 people to meet, the fire circle showed signs of recent activity, and the trees and grounds are just beautiful! The pool was nice but the decking is in bad need of repair. There is a building called the "Peace Chapel" that is intended for meditation; but I think it is really a hobbit house.

The next day, we had basic breakfast but an outstanding lunch. The meeting space was well equipped and comfortable. And, of course, the people were great because they were UU's. So why would you be interested in *The Pines*? UUCT is close enough to make serious use of *The Pines* – for YRUU, committees, board of trustees, or other congregational activities. And even for personal use – want to get away for the weekend – just call 352-796-4457 and one hour later you have escaped for a weekend of R&R! For about \$20 a night (don't quote me on an exact amount), you get a room and breakfast. Just maybe we will run into each other one weekend. Let's make use of this fabulous local resource!!
