

Hassan graduated Magna Cum Laude from the State University of New York at Buffalo with a degree in Political Science concentrating on International Relations. He subsequently graduated amongst the top of his class from the University at Buffalo Law School. He was admitted to the Florida Bar in December 2011. Additionally, Hassan was admitted to practice in Florida's federal courts in April 2012.

He interned with the New York Civil Liberties Union and has written opinions for two New York Supreme Court Judges. In Western New York, Hassan has worked with various legal organizations including Muslim Advocates, National Lawyers Guild, Erie County Bar Association and Erie County Family Court. Hassan lectures regularly on issues relating to Islam, American Muslims and Civil Rights.

Hassan is blissfully married with three beautiful children, and enjoys hiking and jet skiing.


